

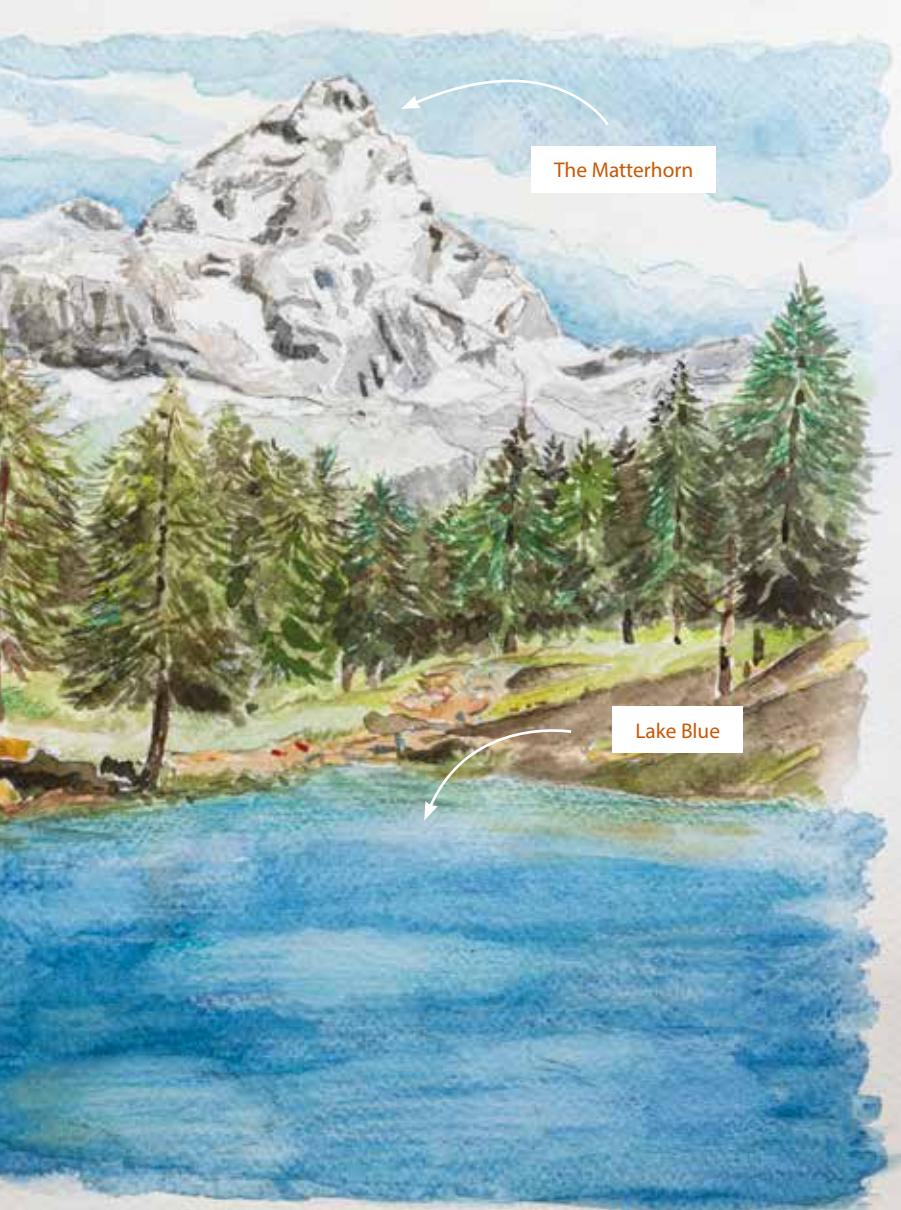

# UNDYING GLORY

Trust me, with difficulty you'll forget this valley once you've laid eyes on it. It's one those places that stay in your heart, whose memory lives on beyond time and space, chasing centuries and millennia, passing from mouth to mouth until it becomes legend. This is a hidden corner among nature's offshoots where it's easy to confuse what belongs to the earth and what belongs to the sky, especially when admiring him - the great Matterhorn - whose dizzying silhouette pierces the clouds and leads the way to unexplored paths in the sky.

This intriguing and enigmatic giant of a mountain, with its proud bearing and stormy look, resembles an immense, lethal predator intent on ploughing an ocean of clouds with its granite fin. The most legendary pages written in mountaineering history concerned this peak - full of ambition, sacrifice, tragedies and acts of courage.

Although the very presence of the Matterhorn would justify the journey, perhaps you'll be surprised to discover that in this valley, Mother Nature didn't stop at one masterpiece but decided to fill it with an incredible number of wonders. So we have lakes dabbled with clouds that reflect silver stars

resembling diamonds, and glittering palaces hewn from ice on which crystal cableways parade, ready to carry you to the top of the world.

Slightly below, luxuriant and fragrant conifer woods, verdant pasturelands and joyful meadows give way to frothy streams, gloomy caves and roaring waterfalls whose music blurs with the noisy call of marmots and the ibex's soft patter.

Here and there small chapels perched on rock warmly welcome mountain pilgrims, while handfuls of villages belonging to a solemn past overlook imposing feats of engineering that are able to

change the fate of mountain tourism forever. A form of tourism that over time has made Cervinia one of the world's most renown tourist destinations, but also the site of scientific and sporting achievements that have entrusted the town and its residents to immortal glory.

## SKIING ALL YEAR ROUND

ON THE SNOW, EVEN IN AUGUST

What if skiing wasn't exclusively a winter pursuit? In fact, you can ski on Plateau Rosà, that awesome tongue of ice lying at an altitude of 3,883 metres throughout the year, even in summer.

It's the icing on the cake of a ski area boasting 360 km of runs and an international connection to Switzerland. Not only can it justly lay claim to being the highest in the Alps but also one of Europe's most extraordinary domaine skiables, offering hundreds of different runs that vary in difficulty, plus countless off-piste tracks and no less than 59 lifts - there to enjoy 365 days a year!

## LAKE BLUE

BEAUTY CALLS BEAUTY



The adjectives “limpid” and “crystalline” are often misused. They’re convenient for describing lakes, even when they are actually murky and impenetrable. For once the definition hits the mark: after all, where else could the Matterhorn, that mountain of otherworldly charm, choose to admire itself than in Lake Blue – a body of water that’s equally magnificent and immortal?

This liquid gem the colour of the sky is a shimmering mantle so pure and transparent that it reflects volatile clouds, gnarled trees, snow-clad peaks...and even your own astonished face as you stand there pondering its beauty.







# THE GREAT MATTERHORN BALCONY

A THRILL AT EVERY STEP

Man strives to construct elaborate buildings when nature already provides all that he needs, even viewpoints over the most panoramic spots in the world. This is what will go through your mind when hiking along the Great Matterhorn Balcony, a loop of about 70 km split into steps with overnight stops in villages along the route.



It's a magnificent trek among lakes, meadows and woodlands, not to mention some of the most amazing spots in the valley, while embracing from afar the proud silhouette of a mountain the mountaineering world considers a legend.

# MATTERHORN ALPINE CROSSING

## TOWARDS INFINITY

From Plateau Rosa's 3,458 metres to Klein Matterhorn's 3,821: in autumn 2022 the futuristic tri-cable gondola defined as the highest crossing in the Alps will be opened connecting Italy and Switzerland.

The panoramic crossing will take an hour and cover a height gain of 4,000 metres in cabins with heated seats, a glass floor and glittering, crystal-sparkled windows. All around lies a sea of shiny snow dotted with granite cliffs dominated by the heart-wrenching outline of that supreme ice pyramid - the Matterhorn.







## THE MATTERHORN WEEK

### THE MOUNTAINS IN TRIUMPH

A whole week dedicated to the Matterhorn, the brave men who have made mountaineering history and those who still today play the leading role in bold and trailblazing ascents.

Seven days of full immersion into mountain culture – from flora to traditional handicraft, courses on climbing, skiing and snowboarding, via ferratas and paragliding, and lastly excursions to conquer 4,000 metres. All in the presence of some of the most eminent figures from the international sports world, but which also features literary meetings, film previews and music events.

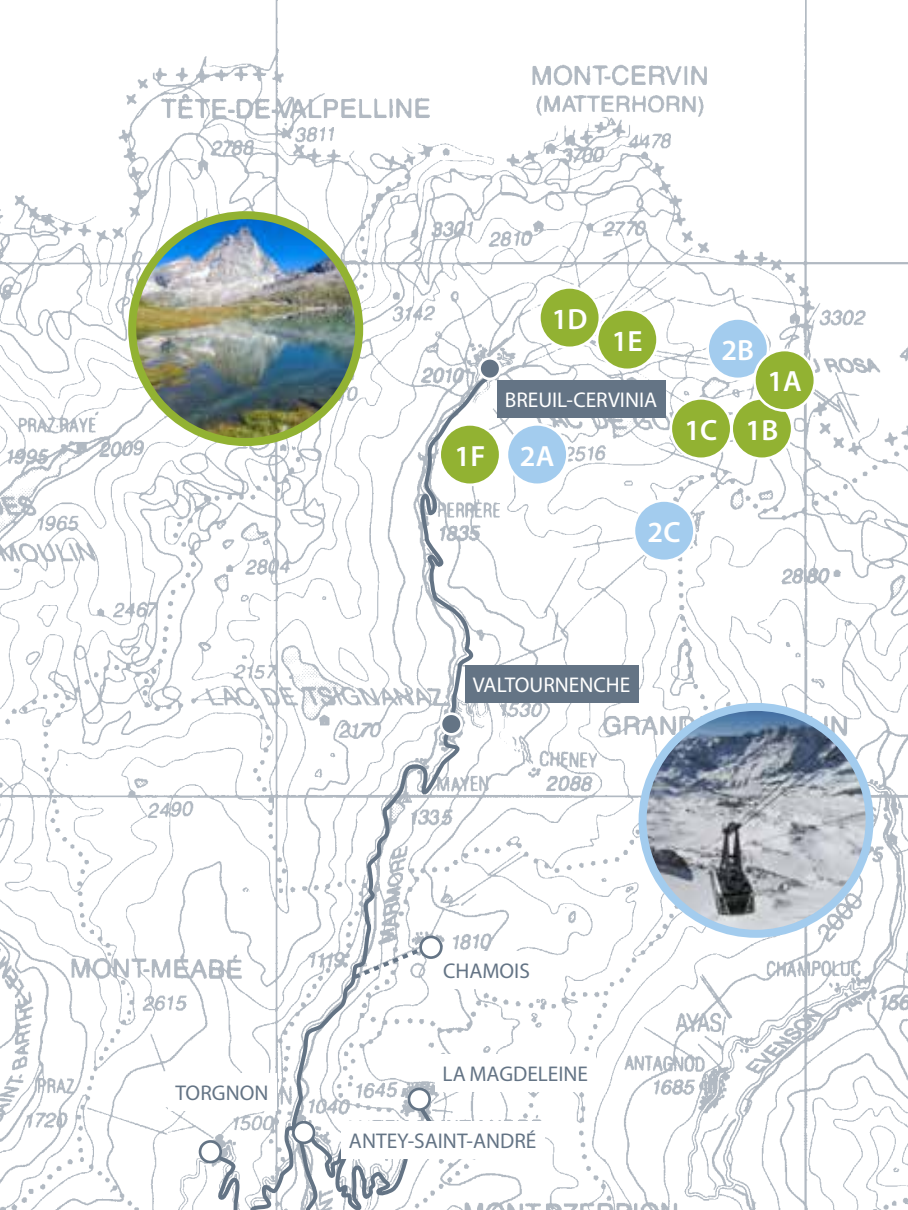
## HOW TO ORGANISE YOUR VISIT

You can customize the recommended itineraries - feel free to include or remove any visits according to your time schedule, interests and spur-of-the-moment decisions!







# BREUIL-CERVINIA AND VALTOURNENCHE IN ONE DAY

## DAY ONE

### 1 Summer

Start the morning with a cable car ride up to Plateau Rosà (1A), a perennial glacier offering all-year skiing, and from here admire the extraordinary mountain vista.

Continue with an interesting visit to the Museum of Work (1B), then hire a guide to explore a crevasse.

After lunch at a high altitude hut, enjoy a hike to Cime Bianche (1C), Plan Maison (1D) or Lake Goillet (1E). On the return journey, stop off at Lake Blue (1F).

### 2 Winter

Devote a day to snow sports: if skiing is not for you, then enjoy an exciting snowshoe excursion into the countryside (2A), otherwise depart from Breuil-Cervinia or Valtournenche and go to Plateau Rosà Glacier (2B), where you'll find elevation drops of over 2,000 metres and a range of runs varying in difficulty, the higher part of which are surrounded by peaks of unrivalled beauty while, further down, they are immersed in conifer woods.

It's certainly worth descending famous "Reine Blanche" piste (2C), one of Europe's longest and most spectacular.

# BREUIL-CERVINIA AND VALTOURNENCHE IN A WEEKEND

## DAY TWO

3

Summer

Depart from the village of Cheneil (3A) and head towards Colle di Chamois (3B), along an evocative walk in view of the Grandes Murailles and the Matterhorn. On reaching enchanting Lake Lod (3C), stop for lunch and then descend to Chamois (3D).

Having visited the town, take the ski lift up to Colle Clavalité (3E) then, on your return to Cheneil (3A), stop for some whipped cream or savour a locally-sourced aperitif at Champève (3F) or Laviel (3G).

4

Winter

Treat yourself to a ski trip in the Swiss International Ski Area of Zermatt (4A), and snap at the chance to visit the old town centre (4B) either on foot or by taking the convenient electric shuttle bus. After lunch, catch Europe's highest train to the summit of Gornergrat (4C) or enjoy several hours' skiing in Sunnegra/Rothorn ski area (4D).

Return by cable car from Klein Matterhorn (4E) and round off with a visit to the panoramic terrace and incredible ice cave.

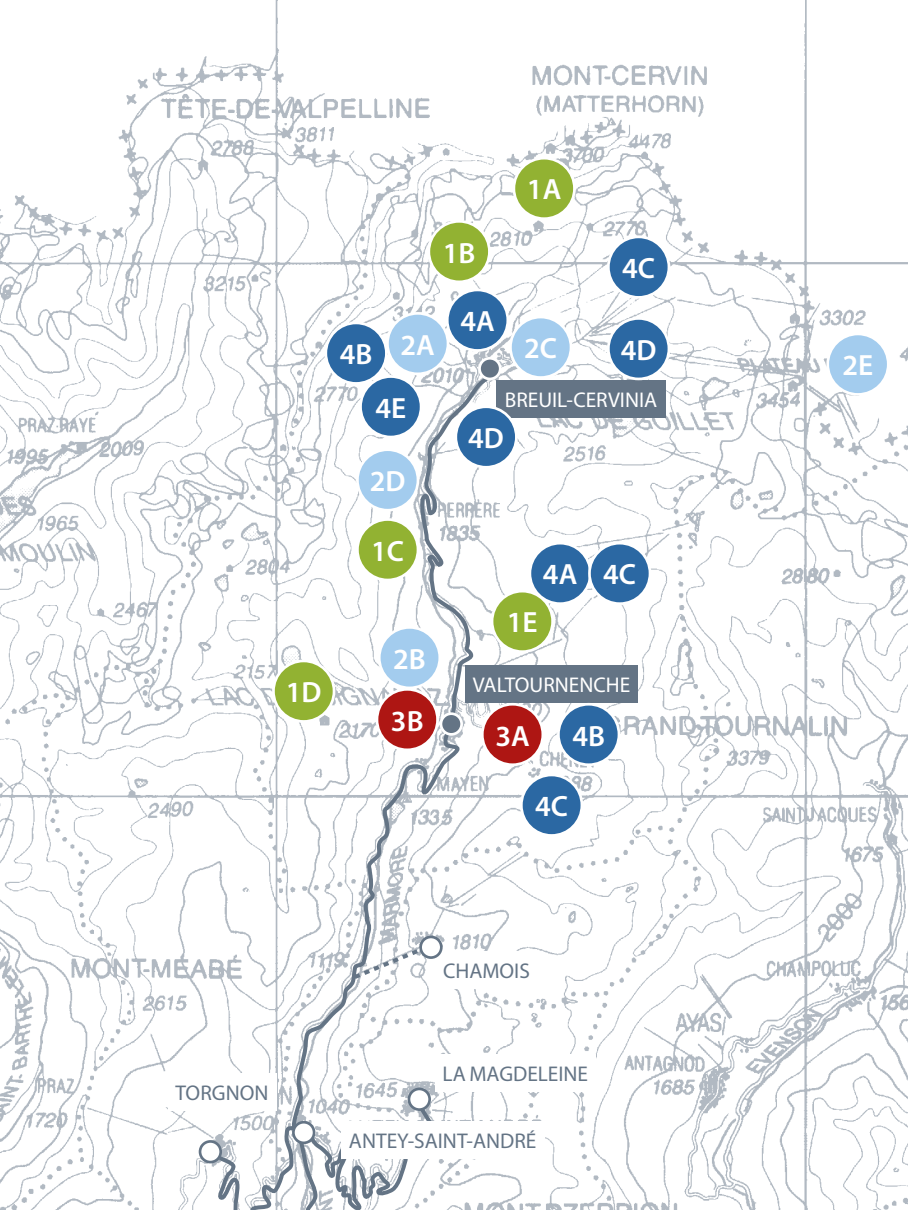

# UNSPOILT SITES

## SUBLIME APPARITIONS

Nature has modelled few things with such refinement as the “Gran Becca” (the Matterhorn). Its sharp and alluring shape draws everyone’s attention, particularly from its favourite valley.

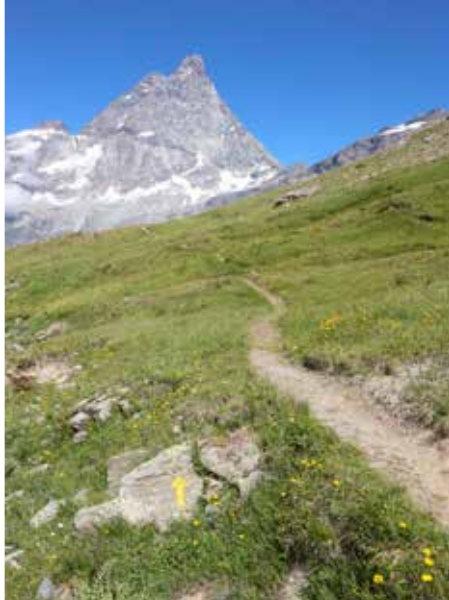
The Matterhorn is not the only striking feature in this land kissed by perennial ice and the fragrance of larch trees: here you’ll come across sapphire lakes resembling the eyes of a god, meadows cupped by the stony hands of mountains and woods traversed by sunny footpaths, which alternate with dull peaks and meadows strewn with a thousand flower confetti...



## JEAN ANTOINE CARREL FOOTPATH AND PERRÈRES/ PROMORON TRAIL

Follow the trail named after the first Italian to summit the Matterhorn and reach historical Duca degli Abruzzi hut at Oriondé. If you prefer shorter hikes, then go deep into conifer woods and among ibex towards Promoron, where a delicious picnic awaits you.

## LAKES CIGNANA AND GOILLET

Two manmade lakes: the former is the largest in Valtournenche – a turquoise gem encircled by emerald shores, the latter is a sky of blue water reflecting a snow-white diamond - the Matterhorn.

A tunnel dug into the ice among iridescent sculptures and sparkling veins: be prepared to explore the highest ice cave in Europe.

# PURE ENERGY

NEVER TIRE OF GETTING TIRED

You can rest assured that carabiners, mountain bikes, snowshoes and skis will become your best friends, keeping you company in an endless number of challenges that harness athletic prowess and spirit of adventure, technical performance and adrenaline rushes...



## FREE CLIMBING

Climbing is compulsory in such a vertical world: artificial and natural walls, bolted walls, indoor walls and crags... Grab your harness and chalk, the mountain will deal with the rest!

An unexplored, virgin-white world waiting in surreal silence to be carved by skis. If you're a fan of heli skiing then an off-piste descent at the foot of the Matterhorn is a must.

Lose yourself along the 3 km trails that embrace an enchanting wall of mountains at Cervinia, or glide along sparkling loops that wend their way through the woods and glades of Champlève at Valtournenche.

# HISTORY ROLLS ON

## A VALLEY OF CONQUESTS

Inhabited as far back in Neolithic times, Valtournenche has for long centuries been the scene of remarkable history. It's a crossroads of people and a land of trade, among pointed peaks and luxuriant slopes, it bears witness to ancient eras - the Roman times and Middle Ages, but also more recent ages dominated by brave men and daring engineering feats.

So you can find museums and exhibitions dedicated to the origins of mountaineering that interweave with a bygone rural legacy comprised of pastoral buildings, religious buildings and lively expressions of folklore...

One is from Cervinia, designed by Luciana Albano in 1950 and worn on social occasions, even by important figures; the other is from Valtournenche and revived thanks to a collection of vintage photographs.

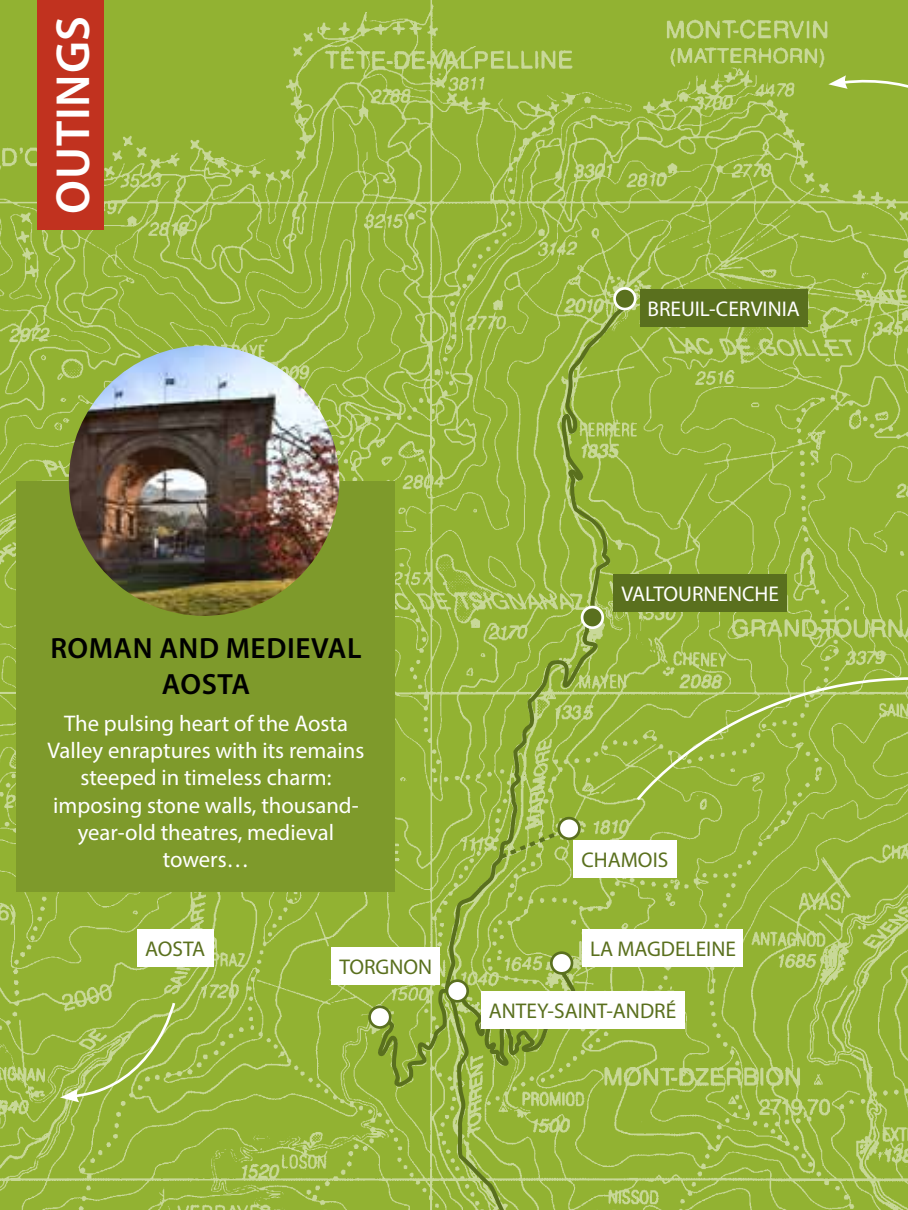
